## **AQA GCSE**

This qualification is for students who wish to develop applied knowledge and practical skills in drama and theatre studies.

The course will consist of both practical and theoretical elements.

| 40% Examination<br>Component 1  | Knowledge and understanding of drama, set text and live performance.  | You will acquire the knowledge necessary to answer questions in the final exam which is divided into three sections; Section A explores the history and genesis of theatre, job roles, staging types and semiotics; Section B looks at the set text "Blood Brothers" including set design, context and performance; Section C studies all aspects of live theatre including analysis of performance.       |
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| 40% Controlled Assessment<br>Component 2<br>(10% performance<br>30% devising log) | The application of performance skills and an accompanying devising log to measure response, development and evaluation. | You will use a range of stimuli to respond, develop and perform a devised piece of work which will be recorded, internally assessed and sent to the exam board for moderation. You will complete a devising log to accompany this piece of work in three parts; response, development and evaluation. Each section should be between 500-700 words and will be internally marked and externally moderated. |
| 20% Externally Assessment<br>Component 3  | Performance of two chronological scenes from an approved play.  | You will select, rehearse, develop and perform two scenes, both ten minutes in length, from a published play that has been approved by the exam board. An external examiner will arrange a visit to observe and mark your performance work in accordance with the specification.   |
