Your guide to transitioning from Year 11 to further education & training.

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Transition means a time of change. In this case, an exciting change from Year 11 to the next stage in your learning or training. This might be on to an apprenticeship or traineeship, or to college or sixth form to study A Levels or vocational/technical courses. Whatever you have decided, or even if you haven't yet made up your mind, this booklet is here to help.

We're all living in a very different world right now and the Corona Virus brought school as you know it to an abrupt end! However, sixth forms, colleges and training providers want to keep you up-to-date on what they are doing to support your move, and over the following few pages you will find information on all of the main providers. If you still don't get the answer you need, there are details of who to contact at each organisation.

Not all apprenticeship training providers are listed in this document. However, the Lancashire Forum provide support for apprenticeships across all of Lancashire and can offer you support. They will be more than happy to help and can be contacted at: info@lancsforum.co.uk

New Directions Careers Service are also keen to support you and can offer one-to-one guidance over the phone. They have up to date information on all providers and can
