We do teach about money, budgeting, tax, bank accounts as part of the "Living in the wider world" topic in the PSHE curriculum. Parents would like it specifically named on the Learning Journey.	We have highlighted within the <i>Living in the wider world</i> modules where this topic is covered.
We do invite community sports clubs into assemblies to promote them joining and participating. Parents explained that the community often faces language barriers and having them explain how and when to apply to the students will benefit them.	We have links with Blackburn Rovers football coaching who visit the school weekly. We have staff supporting students in the enrolment into Harriers running club.
We do run charity fundraising events as part of "Living in the wider world". Our parents would like to know what Charity events are coming up across the year. Parents would also like to see students having the opportunity to reach out to the community.	We have our Christmas jumper charity event Monday 13th December which has been suggested and organised by our student voice. This is communicated with parents via email. We have a history of working with Primary schools and organisations within our community, however, in light of COVID we have been unable to be as active as we would normally. We are looking to increase these links again as soon as we are able, to be in line with National and Local Authority Risk Assessments.
