




AUTHOR OF THE MONTH MICHAEL MORPURGO


Throughout April, the library's focus will be this author's books. Why not pop in for some inspiration?















Happy birthday, William Shakespeare!




The celebrations are usually focussed in Shakespeare's birthplace of Stratford-on-Avon in Warwickshire, and consist of events and a parade in the town.

BORROWBOX APP

The Borrowbox free app has now been installed on all pupils iPads. On the app, you can borrow a wide range eBooks, audiobooks, comics and newspapers. The app, which is run by Blackburn with Darwen libraries, works in the same way as an actual library, where books are loaned for 2 weeks. Pupils can renew their books and reserve titles, which are currently on loan to other members of the public.

Pupils will register for the app in English lessons, but we would be grateful to parents if you could promote this app with your children.

If your child is already registered with Blackburn Library, they can log into the app with their membership number and PIN number.

Pupils were then able to purchase books from the online book fair throughout the Easter holidays.





The Goldfish Boy by Lisa Thompson



Until the day he is the last person to see his next-door neighbour's toddler, Teddy, before he goes missing.

Matthew must turn detective and unravel the mystery of Teddy's disappearance - with the help of a brilliant cast of supporting characters.

Page-turning, heart-breaking, but ultimately life-affirming, this story is perfect for fans of Can You See Me, The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night Time and Wonder.

Murder Most Unladylike by Robin Stevens

When Daisy Wells and Hazel Wong set up their very own secret detective agency at Deepdean School for Girls, they struggle to find any truly exciting mysteries to investigate. (Unless you count the case of Lavinia's missing tie. Which they don't.)

Then Hazel discovers the Science Mistress, Miss Bell, lying dead in the Gym. She assumes it was a terrible accident – but when she and Daisy return five minutes later, the body has disappeared. Now Hazel and Daisy not only have a murder to solve: they have to prove one happened in the first place.

Determined to get to the bottom of the crime before the killer strikes again (and before the police can get there first, naturally), Hazel and Daisy must hunt for evidence, spy on their suspects and use all the cunning and intuition they can muster. But will they succeed? And can their friendship stand the test?

There are 9 other books in the series.

You do not need to read them in order but it is recommended that you read this book first to get to know all the characters.
