Young Enterprise team in full bloom with eco-inspired floral venture



Our Young Enterprise teams will be delivering sustainable flowers and are encouraging cooking for young boys.

Year 10 Sumaya already had a company called Eternal Florals and the Young Enterprise girls' team have adopted this and are going to take it further.

Sumaya said: "I made flowers from ribbons; it takes me around a day to make one. I already do this, but we decided to use it as our base and expand it."

"We are going to crochet bees to go with the flowers and try and use it to encourage people to talk about the environment. We will donate money from the flowers towards buying seeds to plant flower patches which will attract bees, making bees flourish as they are endangered and need our help."

The boys are making chopping boards out of the ends of worktops which are normally thrown away from B&Q. They are promoting cooking to young boys by adding engraved designs of cars and football clubs on them in the corner. They want to promote this age group to help with mental health and make the stigma of cooking being a "woman's job" disappear.

As a Young Enterprise team, the pupils will each have a role, such as a Treasurer or Marketing person, and it's all about how to run a company successfully. They will compete against other Young Enterprise teams in events.



Our Computer Science Club are sending messages to space!

In Computer Science Club, pupils have developed programmes using Python code that will be sent up to the International Space Station.

Every year the European Space Agency partner with Raspberry Pi to allow pupils across Europe to develop programmes that will display a 8 x 8 bit image for the astronauts aboard the ISS to remind them of home.

Programmes have been submitted and pupils will receive a certificate from the ESA in June with full details of where and when the programme was run.

Next term, we will be hosting a Computer Science, Business and Technology competition on "Mission 2040: The Smart Eco School of the future".

Year 7 Abu-Bakr said: "Computer Science Club is a great club. We build Lego, we learn more about coding and we sent a message to the space station. It has a bit of everything."

BBC Bitesize Careers Roadshow inspire our pupils



"The pupils asked thought-provoking questions" was the assessment from host Yussek Rafik after BBC Bitesize Careers Roadshow came to Pleckgate.

Pupils from Years 7–10 were introduced to three guest speakers who told the pupils about their jobs, how they got there and what they enjoy about their careers.

Class of 1997 Pleckgate pupil Reyhana Ismail, who is an illustrator and designer of mainly children's books, was one of the panels alongside Nathaniel Hutchinson, a producer on BBC Sport, and Ermal Sadiku, a university technician, as the roadshow is run in partnership with Technicians: We Make a Difference.

The pupils were told about BBC Bitesize and about the different career paths and which qualifications they may need. They got to ask the panel questions about their careers through an interactive rugby ball, which had a microphone.

Reyhana said: "It's lovely to come back, even though it's a different building to what I was in at school. I wanted to make and sell cakes when I was in Year 9! I didn't even know what I wanted to do when I was 19 but I was always creative."

Nathaniel said: "I wanted to be a footballer when I was younger but now, I get to find out the stories behind the footballers and athletes. We got some great questions here!"

Ermal said: "It's my first time on the BBC Bitesize Career Roadshow Panel but I have enjoyed coming to Pleckgate."

Yussef said: "I enjoy hosting these events and coming into schools. It's my first time at Pleckgate and they are nice kids who are engaged and have asked some thought-provoking questions."
