Dear Parents/Carers

As we near the end of another successful academic year, it seems a great time to reflect and celebrate some of the many achievements of our fantastic pupils. We have had notable success in English, with published poets from Year 7 in a book entitled: 'Empowered: Rhymes of Fire'. The poems ranged from themes on feminism and racism to everyday worries. Our pupils are also amongst the best attenders at the 'Oxplore' Reading Club and have been awarded books and certificates. A particular mention should also go to some of our brightest mathematicians in year 8 and 10 who competed in regional and national maths competitions, establishing themselves as some of the best young mathematicians in the country.

The focus this year has been firmly on academic recovery after the pandemic, and we will continue to provide any additional support pupils need. Year 11 pupils have successfully completed their examination series, and we wish them all the best for results day in August. However, it is not just academic success that we have focussed on, we have worked hard to support pupils with a wide range of extracurricular activities including The Duke of Edinburgh award, visits to the theatre, sporting activities and visits, a range of rewards trips. We have also encouraged pupils to develop leadership responsibility including as reading and maths mentors, prefects and leaders of the Pupil Council.

As we prepare for the last week in school, it is particularly important that parents are aware there is a **heatwave** forecast for early next week, and as a result, we are **advising the following measures**:
