




AUTHOR OF THE MONTH – RICK RIORDAN









WINTER BOOKS


KS3 BOOK RECOMMENDATIONS



Time Riders by Alex Scarrow


Liam O'Connor should have died at sea in 1912. Maddy Carter should have died on a plane in 2010. Sal Vikram should have died in a fire in 2029.


That's why the Time Riders exist: to protect us. To stop time travel from destroying the world . . .


