Introduction

Transition means a time of change. In this case, an exciting change from Year II to the next stage in your learning or training. This might be on to an apprenticeship or traineeship, or to college or sixth form to study A Levels or vocational/technical courses. Whatever you have decided, or even if you haven't yet made up your mind, this booklet is here to help.

We're all living in a very different world right now and the Corona Virus has brought huge disruptions to your education and knowledge of Post 16 options. However, sixth forms, colleges and training providers want to keep you up-to-date on what they are doing to support your move, and over the following few pages you will find information on all of the main providers. If you still don't get the answer you need, there are details of who to contact at each organisation.
