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




October 2023

During this live online author event our pupils will hear from best-selling children's authors Phil Earle, David Farr, Hiba Noor Khan and Tony Bradman, as Mr Dilly interviews them about their war themed stories. We will have the opportunity to hear some read-alouds from their books and listen in as they speak about the importance of remembrance, hope and peace.

Live author event with SF Said - Friday 10th November

SF Said is a British Muslim author of Middle Eastern origin. He was born in Beirut, Lebanon, and came to live in Britain when he was 2 years old. He will tell the story of how he went from being a young reader like the children to writing award-winning books such as Tyger, Phoenix and Varjak Paw, which was listed by BookTrust as one of the 100 best children's books of the past 100 years. His talk will include material about his own childhood reading, insights into the writing process, a reading from Tyger, and a live Q&A at the end!

Science Fiction Month

Celebrated on January 2nd every year, Science Fiction Day celebrates everything science fiction. Sci Fi typically deals with imaginative and futuristic concepts such as advanced science and technology, space exploration, time travel, parallel universes, and extra terrestrial life.

It often also has aspects of dystopia featuring a hypothetical society, set in the future or near future, where the population is faced with disastrous political, societal, technological, religious, and environmental situations.

- **Decorate a Door** Year 7 and 8 will be working in their tutor groups to decorate their classroom door on the theme of a book of their choice. Staff judges, including the school librarian Mrs Hanson, will pick their favourite doors with prizes for the winning tutor group
- **Book Tokens** Each pupil will receive a World Book Day token to claim a free or discounted book from bookshops and supermarkets
- **Borrowbox assembly** Blackburn library will be coming into school will deliver an assembly to promote Borrowbox (Blackburn library's online library) and explain to pupils how they can join
- **Book recommendations activities** Each year group will have five book recommendations suitable for their age. They will have the opportunity to watch a trailer of the book and then read the opening extract

Joseph is an award-winning performance poet, playwright and children's author. His books include the critically acclaimed Luna Loves... series, If All The World Were, and the CLiPPA-shortlisted collection of poems, Overheard in a Tower Block.

Writing Thrillers & Horror with SJ Wills live event - Friday 15th March

We will taking part in a live event with SJ Wills to discover how she became an author, what inspired her thrilling teen werewolf 'Bite Risk' series, and what we can expect from book 2, Caught Dead (Bite Risk). You'll also hear her top tips for writing great thrillers and suspense. She has worked as a freelance copyeditor since 2003, alongside rediscovering my childhood love: writing my own stories.



April 2024

Classics Month

A classic is a novel that represents a genre or a writing style, or it can be a novel that makes a contribution to literature. There are all kinds of classics, from horror to romance, from novels that sold millions of copies to a novel that changed how a genre was written.

On Tuesday 2nd April we celebrate International Children's Book Day. For centuries the importance of reading has been taught in schools. This day brings awareness to reading and how essential it is in molding the young minds of the future.

During this month pupils will be encouraged to borrow and read Classic novels both written for children and young adults alike.

Sarah Crossan live author event - Monday 22nd April

In this live author event we will meet award-winning author and poet Sarah Crossan, who introduces her new book, Where the Heart Should Be, set in 1846 in Ireland during the Great Famine; a powerful and thought-provoking novel in verse.

Sarah studied philosophy and literature before training as an English and drama teacher, and then becoming a writer. Sarah was the Laureate na nóg (Ireland's Children's Literature Laureate) from 2018–2020. She won the CILIP Carnegie Medal in 2016 for her novel One, which also won the YA Book Prize and the CliPPA Poetry Award. Moonrise was shortlisted for the Costa Children's Book Awards 2017 and the YA Book Prize 2018.

Shakespeare Day - Tuesday 23rd April

Many fans and enthusiasts across the world celebrate Shakespeare Day on 23rd April every year to honour the birth of Shakespeare. His birth date was never officially recorded as it was not the norm in that era. However, people from all over the world have considered April 23 as his date of birth. He also died on 23rd April in 1616, when he was 52 years of age.
