Holocaust Memorial Day 2026 – Bridging Generations

Our Anne Frank Ambassadors proudly represented Pleckgate at the Holocaust Memorial Day Remembrance earlier this week in the Cathedral Crypt at Blackburn Cathedral, alongside the Mayor, members of the Interfaith Forum, the Deputy Youth MP and pupils from other local schools.

This year's theme, 'Bridging Generations', focused on the responsibility of younger generations to learn from survivors where possible, and through research and education about the Holocaust and other genocides when this is no longer possible.

Pupils' reflections were combined into a collective statement, delivered by the Youth MP on behalf of secondary schools across the town.

During their visit, pupils also explored The Longest Yarn II – Britain at War exhibition, further deepening their understanding of remembrance and shared responsibility.
