Welcome to Pleckgate High School, a thriving multi-cultural community that places the best interests of young people at the heart of everything we do. All students are challenged and supported to Aspire and Believe, Act and Succeed.

We are a large secondary school situated on the northern outskirts of Blackburn with Darwen, comprising 1100 students and 170 staff with state of the art facilities that benefit both the school and local community. We were awarded 'Outstanding' status by Ofsted in 2019 and were described as a school that the 'local community can be proud of, that provides an outstanding education for all its students'.

At Pleckgate everyone is committed to providing the best educational experiences and opportunities for our students. We provide all our students with 1:1 home learning devices so that our students can learn successfully at home or in school and parents have a good knowledge of the curriculum offered by the school. Every student at Pleckgate is encouraged to have ambitious goals and everybody is responsible for creating a culture of high expectations and academic excellence.

Aims of the Year 7 Curriculum

Successful Transition

The Year 7 curriculum at Pleckgate High School is designed to ensure a successful transition from primary to secondary school. We pride ourselves on the success of our Pastoral Team in ensuring our year 7 students are supported to "Aspire and Believe, Act and Succeed" from the start of their journey at Pleckgate.

Confidence building and independent learning

We aim to support your child in becoming a confident learner through a well-rounded educational experience that extends well beyond the classroom. We encourage parents to support their children in home study. Homework is a key part of students' learning, encouraging them to be independent and well organised.

We encourage students at Pleckgate to be involved in our extensive charity work, participate in educational visits and work in partnership with local schools and colleges. Student leadership is a key aspect of life at Pleckgate through the Student Council, PE and the Youth Sports Trust, school librarians, reading mentors and students leading assemblies. There are many opportunities for your child to be involved in extracurricular activities to help them gain confidence and work with others. We work closely with the Anne Frank Trust and the Diana Award for students to have wider experiences to support their personal development.

Reading School

All students have access to our online reading platform myon.co.uk which offers a range of fiction and nonfiction texts to suit all interests and abilities. We encourage students to read widely and regularly and we offer a well-resourced library that students can access at break and lunchtime, as well as after school. We also encourage parents to read regularly with their child as we know that a child who reads well makes excellent academic progress in all subject areas.

Specific development of numeracy and literacy

Due to the last twelve months, students have missed time out of school and may have some gaps in reading, writing and mathematics. We have a well organised team in both the English and mathematics departments, who have resources and strategies in place to support your child to catch up in both literacy and numeracy. This support is offered to your child in addition to their regular curriculum and has proven success at Pleckgate.

Academic Transition from Key stage 2 to key stage 3

As the opportunities for new students to visit our school have been limited over the past twelve months, we have provided key information for parents and students on our website <u>here</u>. However our SENCO, Ms Janet Knowles and the Year 7 Head of Year, Miss Ashford speak to all primary school teachers so there is a clear focus on academic transition from key stage two to key stage three.

Personal, Social, Health and Emotional Wellbeing

Students' well-being is very important to us; students are supported by a strong pastoral team who get to know your child very well and support them as they adapt to the new routines and life at secondary school. Students have weekly assemblies and daily tutor time, where they have the opportunity to discuss, share ideas and ask questions with members of staff they know well.



Enrichment Days

At Pleckgate High School, all year 7 students will take part in Enrichment Experiences. These are whole days when students are taken off their traditional timetable and give opportunities to promote self esteem, leadership and responsibility. Students also work with local colleges, employers and other schools to have meaningful interactions to help them develop confidence and provide advice and guidance about their future steps.

RSE Curriculum

RSE stands for Relationships and Sex Education; it is now compulsory for schools to deliver this new curriculum although parents have the right to withdraw their child, if they wish from the sex education aspects. However our staff have the correct training and experience to deliver the information they need to allow them to develop healthy and safe relationships. We also want to make students encourage self-respect and consideration of others as well as preparing students as to how to avoid unnecessary dangers and risks. Homework

We are grateful to parents and carers who check and monitor the home learning of students. We provide each child with a 1:1 learning device so they can record homework through Google Classroom. Parents can check this daily so that they are aware of homework that has been set. Please see the guidance on homework below.

It is important that, as parents, you encourage your child to complete any homework set in school. Homework teaches your child to work independently whilst allowing them to review and practice work that has been covered in class. It helps your child develop positive study skills that will serve him or her well throughout life.

At Pleckgate we recommend that year 7 students are given up to 30 minutes of homework per subject, per week.

Subjects Studied

Students are organised into two academic bands. P and Q are then taught within these sets. Codes are used for class sets, for example 7p/En1 is the top set in P band for English, 7q/Ma5 is the bottom set in Q band for maths. All lessons are taught for 60 minutes.

Target Setting and Reports for Parents.

Target setting for students is based on knowledge about expected rates of progress and data for each individual child. Teachers monitor progress carefully against these targets and plan lessons accordingly to ensure sufficient progress for all students regardless of their starting points in school.

Written and verbal feedback should usually include comments about what a student has done well and what they need to consider in order to make good progress. Parents are informed of progress against their child's targets in our termly school reports. It is important to remember that children will progress at different rates and a huge range of factors influence this rate of progress.

We work closely with our partner primary schools to gain an understanding of the expected level your child is currently working at. As there have not been any SATS this year, we use CAT tests, cognitive ability tests to assess the potential of each student and place them into an appropriate set. Setting is reviewed regularly and student assessment information is used as part of this process.

Subject teachers review student targets regularly. If a student is making excellent progress, the target will be revised upwards. When students do not meet their target in a number of subjects we need to explore the reasons why. There are a range of support strategies that we will employ to try to ensure individual students make good progress, and it is in these circumstances that the partnership between parents and school is most important.

Every student at Pleckgate is encouraged to have ambitious goals and we remain committed to the pursuit of outstanding teaching and learning alongside the highest possible academic standards.







PE Extra-Curricular Activities

Your child spends more time at school than anywhere else except home. Schools can have a major effect on children's health. Schools can teach children about health and promote healthy behaviours.
