Confidence building

As your child has completed their second year at Pleckgate, they are now familiar with the regular routines and systems in place at school and can begin to flourish and gain experience in other aspects of school life.

Whether it be our extensive charity work, numerous educational visits or our partnerships with other local schools and colleges, you can be assured that your child will receive a well-rounded education that extends well beyond the classroom



Working towards option subjects

Your child will also make their first important decisions about their future in Year 9, when they decide their option choices as to which subjects they will study at GCSE for the remaining two years of their education at Pleckgate.

High Expectations

We expect Year 9 pupils at Pleckgate to work consistently hard and insist that they produce classwork and homework of the highest possible quality.

Reading School

All pupils have access to our online reading platform myon.co.uk which offers a range of fiction and nonfiction texts to suit all interests and abilities. We encourage pupils to read widely and regularly and we offer a well-resourced library that pupils can access at break and lunchtime, as well as after school.



We also encourage parents to read regularly with their child as we know that a child who reads well makes excellent academic progress in all subject areas.

Aims of the Year 9 Curriculum

Numeracy and literacy

Due to the last twelve months, pupils have missed time out of school and may have some gaps in reading, writing and mathematics. We have a well organised team in both the English and mathematics departments, who have resources and strategies in place to support your child to catch up in both literacy and numeracy.



This support is offered to your child in addition to their regular curriculum and has proven success at Pleckgate. We offer this support to pupils in Year 7 and 8 but for those who require additional support, this one to one catch up is offered for pupils in Year 9 so they can continue to make progress in all subjects

Personal, Social, Health and Emotional Wellbeing

Pupils' well-being is very important to us; pupils are supported by a strong pastoral team who know your child very well and are able to support them with any difficulties they may face both academically and pastorally. Pupils have weekly assemblies and daily tutor time, where they have the opportunity to discuss, share ideas and ask questions with members of staff they know well.

Enrichment Days



At Pleckgate High School, all Year 9 pupils will take part in Enrichment Experiences.

These are whole days when pupils are taken off their traditional timetable and give opportunities to promote self-esteem, leadership and responsibility.

Pupils also work with local colleges, employers and other schools to have meaningful interactions to help them develop confidence and provide advice and guidance about their future steps.

Aims of the Year 9 Curriculum

RSE Curriculum

RSE stands for Relationships and Sex Education; it is now compulsory for schools to deliver this new curriculum although parents have the right to withdraw their child, if they wish from the sex education aspects. However our staff have the correct training and experience to deliver the information they need to allow them to develop healthy and safe relationships.



Homework

We are grateful to parents and carers who check and monitor the home learning of pupils.

We provide each child with a 1:1 learning device so they can record homework through Google Classroom.

Parents can check this daily so that they are aware of homework that has been set.

It is important that, as parents, you encourage your child to complete any homework set in school.

Homework teaches your child to work independently whilst allowing them to review and practice work that has been covered in class.

It helps your child develop positive study skills that will serve him or her well throughout life.

At Pleckgate we recommend that Year 9 pupils are given up to 30 minutes of homework per subject, per week.

Subjects studied

All lessons are taught for 60 minutes.

Target setting & reports

Target setting for pupils is based on knowledge about expected rates of progress and data for each individual child. Teachers monitor progress carefully against these targets and plan lessons accordingly to ensure sufficient progress for all pupils regardless of their starting points in school.

Written and verbal feedback should usually include comments about what a pupils has done well and what they need to consider in order to make good progress. Parents are informed of progress against their child's targets in our termly school reports. It is important to remember that children will progress at different rates and a huge range of factors influence this rate of progress.



When your child joined us in Year 7, we used CAT tests, cognitive ability tests to assess the potential of each pupil and place them into an appropriate set. Setting is reviewed regularly and pupil assessment information is used as part of this process.

Subject teachers review pupils targets regularly. If a pupil is making excellent progress, the target will be revised upwards. When pupils do not meet their target in a number of subjects we need to explore the reasons why.

There are a range of support strategies that we will employ to try to ensure individual pupils make good progress, and it is in these circumstances that the partnership between parents and school is most important.

Every pupils at Pleckgate is encouraged to have ambitious goals and we remain committed to the pursuit of outstanding teaching and learning alongside the highest possible academic standards.

Extra-Curricular Activities

Your child spends more time at school than anywhere else except home. Schools can have a major effect on children's health.

Schools can teach children about health and promote healthy behaviours. Physical education classes give children a chance to get exercise. At Pleckgate we take this further through our bespoke Youth Sports Trust programme and our extensive extra-curricular offers.



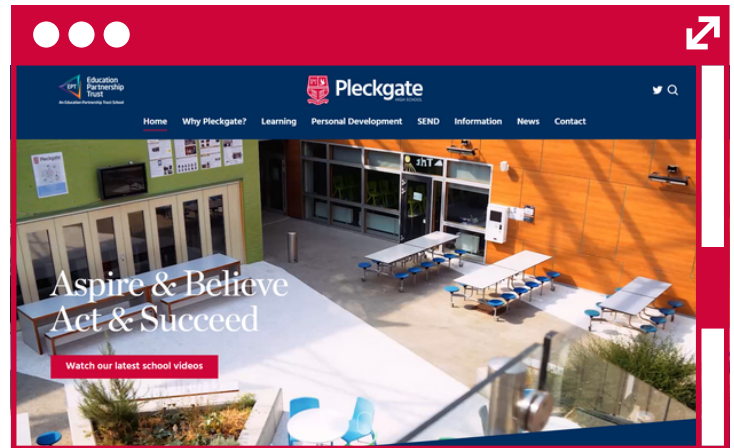
